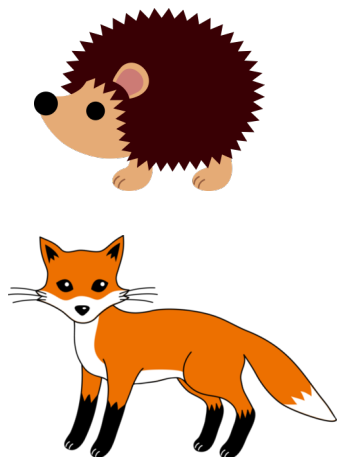

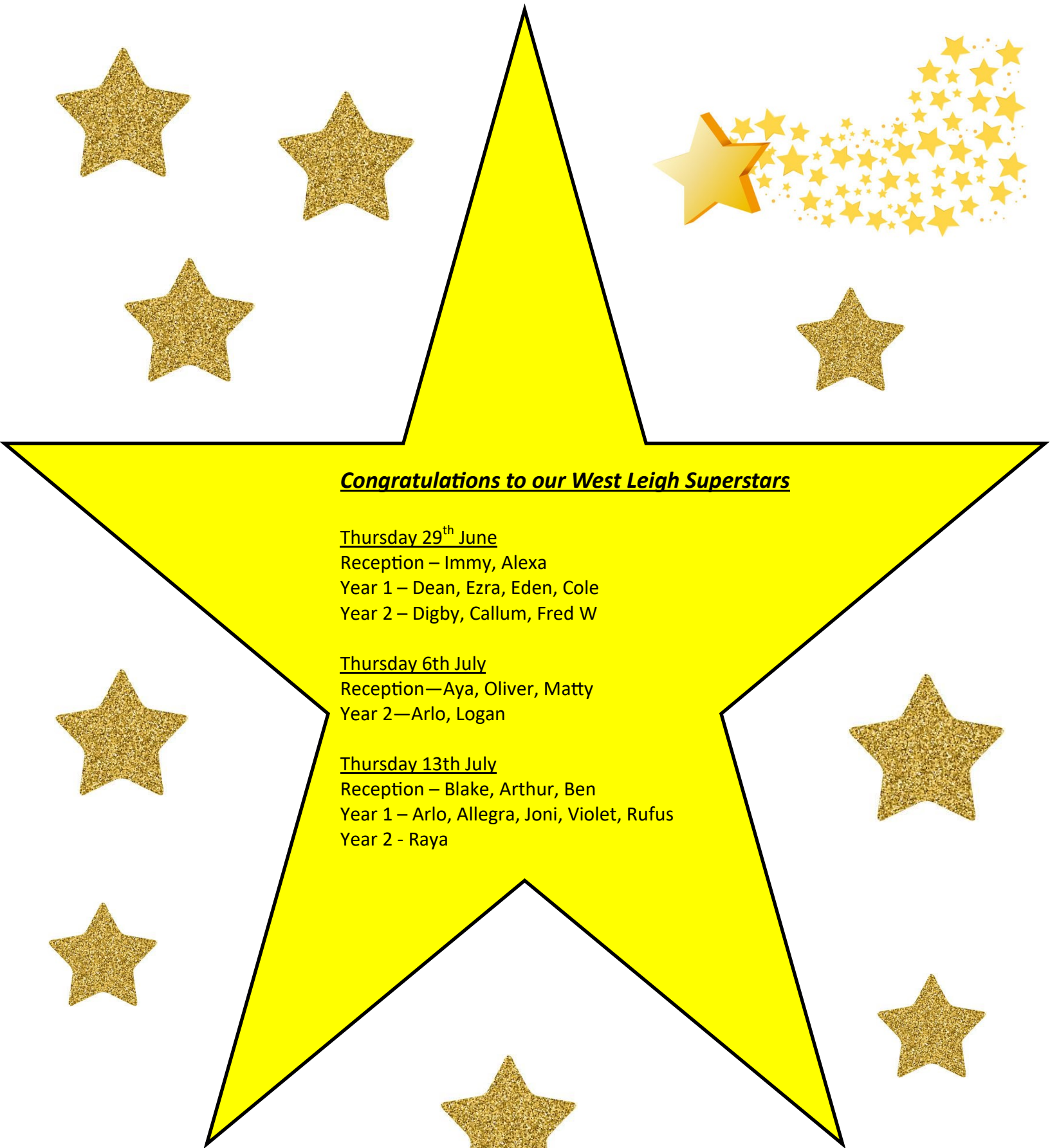

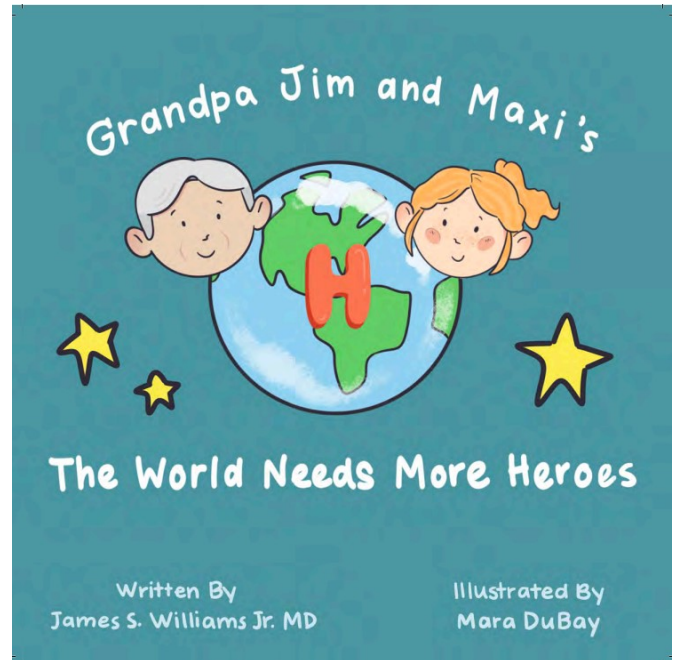

## Reception Chicks

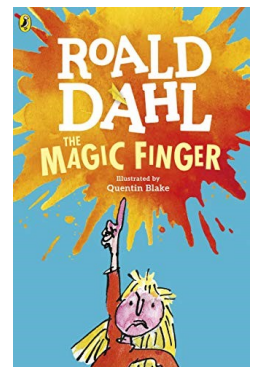

## Hedgehog Class News

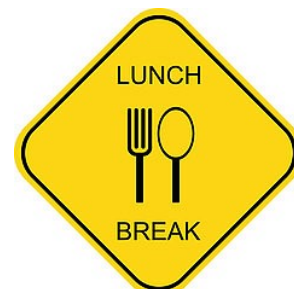
