


Owl Class have been working hard over the last few weeks and Mrs Bowden-Green is very impressed with how well all of the children have settled into life in Year 1!

In Maths we have been busy counting, sorting and looking at Place Value with numbers up to 10.


We have also been reading the stories of Stanley's Stick and Billy and the Beast in our English lessons.

This week the children have looked at the work of Andy Goldsworthy and created these lovely spiral artworks using natural items that they collected from the playground. Fantastic effort Owl Class!


































New school year, new PTA Committee...

#### Nasal Flu Vaccination Programme

This autumn all children from Reception to Year 11 are being offered a flu vaccine as part of the School Vaccination Programme. This letter explains why children are being offered this vaccine and explains how to let us know whether or not you would like your child to be vaccinated.

Children are being offered the vaccinations to protect them from flu, minimise the circulation of the virus this winter and to reduce disruption to their education, and the potential impact on the NHS. The vaccinations will be given by Sirona care & health, who run all the School Immunisation Programmes in our area.

The flu vaccine is administered using a nasal spray.

Please complete the consent form below, indicating whether you wish your child to have the vaccine. If you don't have access to the internet, you can request a paper copy from your child's school.

Please complete the form as soon as possible, the consent system will be closed at 9am 2 working days before the session. Your school will tell you the date of the session once it is confirmed.

Please ensure you complete the consent form even if you do not want your child to receive the vaccination

If your child is not able to attend school on the day of the Immunisation session they can attend a catch-up clinic at a later date. Your school will send out information about these clinics after the school session.

If your child is unable to accept the nasal flu vaccine due to the porcine gelatine content or due to immunosuppression we are able to offer an IM Flu injection at a community clinic, to book an appointment for this please contact the School Immunisation Team on the details below.








Year 3 have been settling into BJS, beautifully. Over the last few weeks, the children have been working hard on writing setting descriptions based on the Forest of Sin in Roald Dahl's, 'The Minpins', as well beginning our Geography and History topic of 'Tomb Raiders'. The children enjoyed their first History lesson searching for historians missing documents and discussing what they already know about Ancient Egypt. In Science, the children began our Animals including Humans unit by being given an animal and putting themselves into the Venn diagram by deciding whether they were a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore. A great start to the year. Well Done Year 3.









# 6M visit to Tithe Barn

On Monday 25th September, 6M visited the Tithe Barn in Nailsea as part of their topic on Victorians.

During the day we learnt about the history of the barn and Hannah More, who started a school in the 18th century as she felt it was important for children to read and write and know about God.

She felt it was important to encourage children and not beat them. She was a famous writer and was against slavery. We dressed up as Victorian children and had some lessons Victorian style.

We wrote on slate boards and drew a Victorian artefact, such as a carpet beater. The slates made a weird scratching noise and you had to press just the right amount for it to show. Instead of calculators they used an abacus to do their maths – the concept was simple so it made the maths easier.

We also studied an original school register and log book from Victorian times.

There seem to be a lot of diseases such as measles and scarlet fever.

We thought it was very funny that they called the toilets "the offices" at this time. The toilets had no roofs so that the children were quick and didn't miss lesson time!

The Tithe Barn was great fun; we learnt a lot of things and hope to visit again. 6M











# Pupil Chaplains Help St Andrew's Church Achieve Bronze Echo-Award

Each year the Pupil Chaplain team at Backwell Junior School takes part in two community missions. Last school year the children enjoyed serving a meal at The Meeting Point at the Parish Hall. Following their discussion about caring for the environment with Bishop Michael Beasley at their commissioning service, the chaplains decided to get involved in St Andrew's Eco Church application.

The team feels strongly about caring for our planet, Zoe (Backwell Junior School - Year 6) writes "I chose to be part of this topic because looking after our planet is crucial to our survival. It is our duty to take care of the gifts we've been given. Everything we need to save it is right in front of us and we are deciding not to use it, it's very frustrating to see. A few weeks ago, global warming turned into 'global boiling', so this issue is even more urgent. We can't just do nothing!" Rory is concerned about littering in Backwell: "I see people littering more and more. Just the other day I saw lots of kids from the secondary school leave all their cans and wrappers lying around in the Playing Fields, it made me sad. The planet is important, because it's the only place we have to live, and I don't want that to be gone for the next generation".

The Pupil Chaplains visited the St Andrew's Harvest service at Moorside Farm to tell our congregation about their involvement in the application process, and to show the amazing plaque we received after A Rocha awarded us a Bronze Certificate. Although proud of this achievement, the children are already working on an Action Plan to get St Andrew's up to a Silver!
