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Year 5 Maths

Year 5 put their investigative hats on during our inspirational maths days and focused on spirals!

Archimedian Spirals

Archimedes, a well known Ancient Greek mathematician, created the Archimedian spiral: a spiral where the gaps between the curves of the spiral are always the same distance apart (based on a set of concentric circles).

We used this as a basis for creating our own spirals using colouring pencils.

Baravelle Spirals

Baravelle Spirals are a special type of 'nesting' spiral. They are formed by marking the centre point of each side of the polygon, then connecting the marks. This creates triangles that are the same length on two sides (isosceles triangles). Colour is then used to show the spirals create



Autism Central aims to build knowledge and understanding of autism and empower families and carers to advocate for autistic people they support to get the right understanding and adjustments in place across the services they use. 


