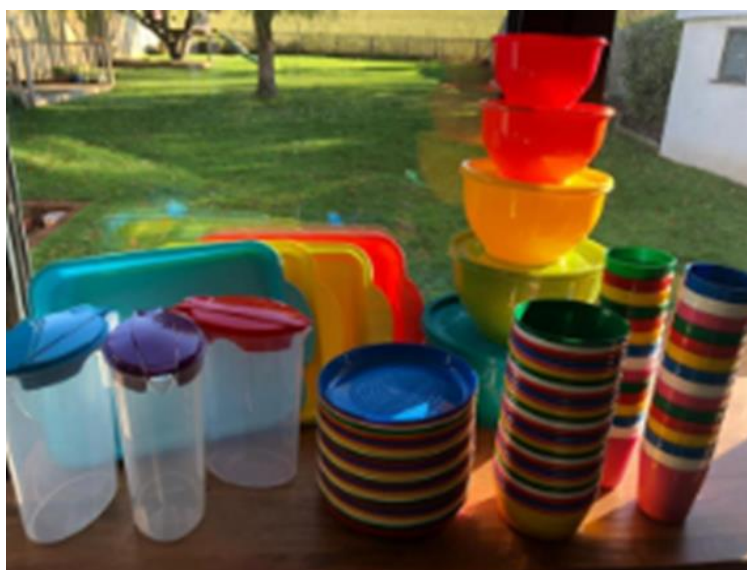
Party Kit Hire

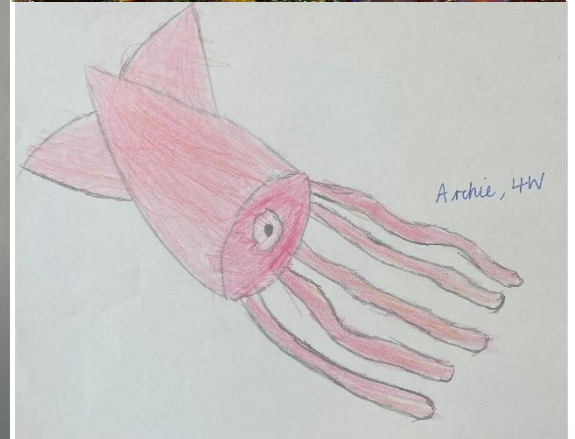
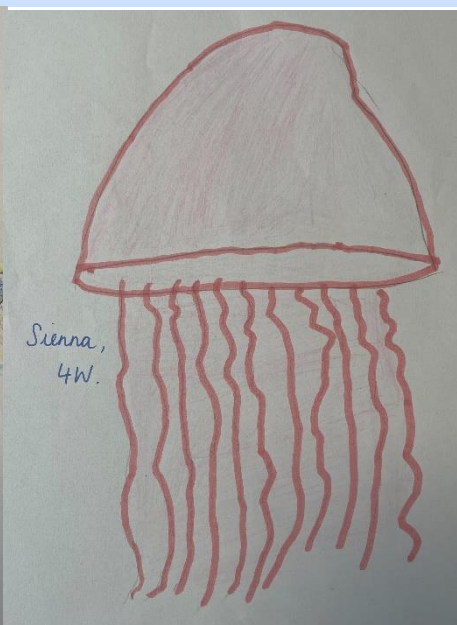
