How to be Sun Safe with Shade Man



Sunscreen must be applied before you go outside in the sun for it to work.



Wear sunglasses and don't look directly at the sun



To keep protected you should use all forms of cover including hats, sunglasses, clothing, sunscreen and shade



Wear a hat such as a sun cap like mine to keep your head cool and protected



Don't stay in the sun any longer than 15 minutes without protection



Keep hydrated, especially on very warm days



Always play in the shade



Reapply sunscreen regularly even when using 'once a day' and 'water resistant' sunscreens

Outdoor Learning Sessions April/May 2025

Hedgehog Class had an exciting start to the new term with our Outdoor Learning session with Mr Welti. First we explored the plants growing around the school field for signs of spring, and spotted lots of buds just beginning to bloom into flower.

Then we looked at the different parts of a flower, by carefully taking daisies apart. Finally, we collected fresh spring leaves and flowers, and experimented with Hapa Zome - the Japanese art of transferring coloured pigments from plant materials onto fabric or paper by pounding with a hammer. All of this was inspired by the story -Bloom, by Anne Booth. We can't wait for our next Outdoor Learning sessions!

Wonderful Windrush Generation

Have you ever wondered exactly what the Windrush Generation was? In 1948 Caribbean men and women came to Britain to help in the war effort. This report tells you about Windrush Generation and the effects

What is the Windrush Generation

When Caribbean men and women came to help in the war effort (1948-1971.) They also helped fill in jobs and rebuild Britain after the war.

Princess Campbell

In 1962 Princess came from Kingston to Britain. When she arrived, her first job was at Will's tobacco factory and she was well known as the first black word sister. She got most of the weekend and night jobs. In 2011 she was awarded an MBE.



The HMT Windrush set off in 1948.



Paul Stephenson

In 1963 Paul Stephenson organised the first boycott against the Bristol Omnibus Company for refusing to recruit black and Asian people.

The experiences of the Windrush Generation

Many people had bad experiences caused by racism. Lots of black got terrible jobs (cleaning and working weekends.) People who were older and experienced got tired turned down.



The effects of the Windrush Generation

In 2018 the Caribbean immigrants became illegal and would be deported back to the Caribbean. Some people had to pay masses of money like Albert Thomson who paid £54,000 for cancer treatment.

Did you know?

- Many people were made homeless because the government deliberately raised the rent prices.
- The HMT Windrush took 8 weeks to travel from Jamaica to London.
- The ship held 1,027 people.
- Nearly 500,000 emigrated between 1948-1970.

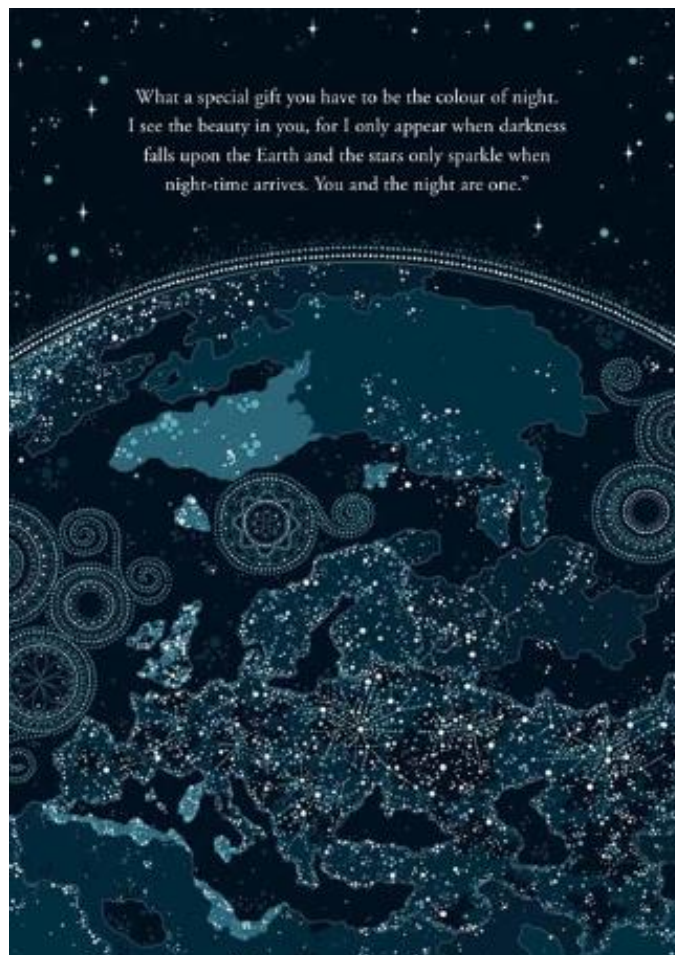
Panther muttered, "But Leopard told me I was boring,"

Panther declared to the moon with a shout, 'I am panther!'

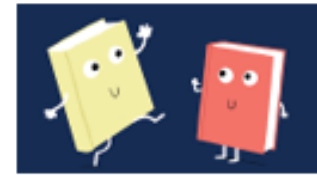
Theo K - 4W

The other arm of being a competent reader, alongside reading fluently, is reading comprehension (understanding the text). Once word reading is mastered at KS1/ Lower KS2, this is our main focus when teaching reading at the Juniors. Our reading lessons will either centre around a single reading comprehension skill or a combination. The children are well-versed in the 'Reading Dogs' which link to each of the comprehension skills.

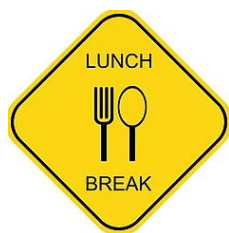

Parking at BJS

The school office have received a large number of neighbourhood complaints regarding parking at school and in the surrounding roads. There has been an increase in the number of parents dropping their children off by car directly opposite Backwell Juniors. We'd like to remind everyone that it is not permitted to stop on the painted zig zag lines outside school, but it is also unsafe to park on the road due to the narrowness of the lanes etc.

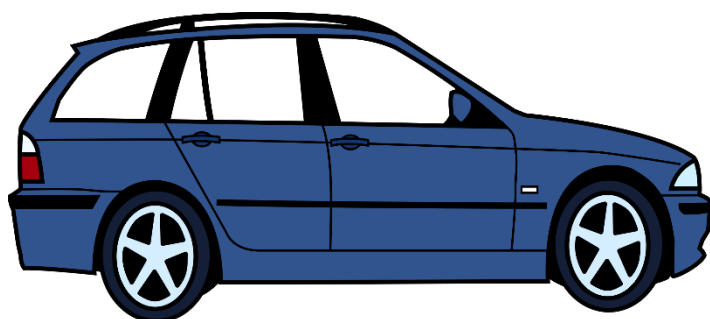
Several children have mentioned that they feel unsafe walking to and from school due to the speed and number of cars on this road and so we politely ask for you to refrain from dropping off in these areas and park on Dark Lane and walk the short distance to school to drop off/pick up. This additional 5 minutes is a small ask given these safety concerns.

Large vehicles have been unable to pass on Church Lane and the congestion level at school times is excessive.

As well as being very concerned about reports of people being rude to other road users and our neighbours we are very concerned that if larger vehicles are unable to pass then emergency vehicles will also be unable to reach a destination in an emergency situation which in turn could have devastating results to the community.

We ask you all to consider your parking – leave a little earlier for a space near school or park a little further away in a safe manner. Community Police have been informed and we have requested assistance in managing this going forward.
