

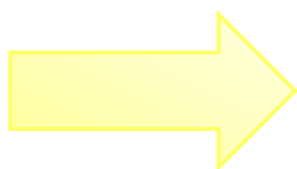

The Importance of Punctuality

4.5 Lateness and punctuality

Punctuality is an important skill for life and we want our young people to build good habits as they move into adulthood. Being punctual demonstrates a respect for others in the class as well as for the staff and can also help make a positive start to the school day. A pupil who is persistently late can miss crucial messages, opportunities to socialise with other pupils as well as key learning that happens at the beginning of the school day.

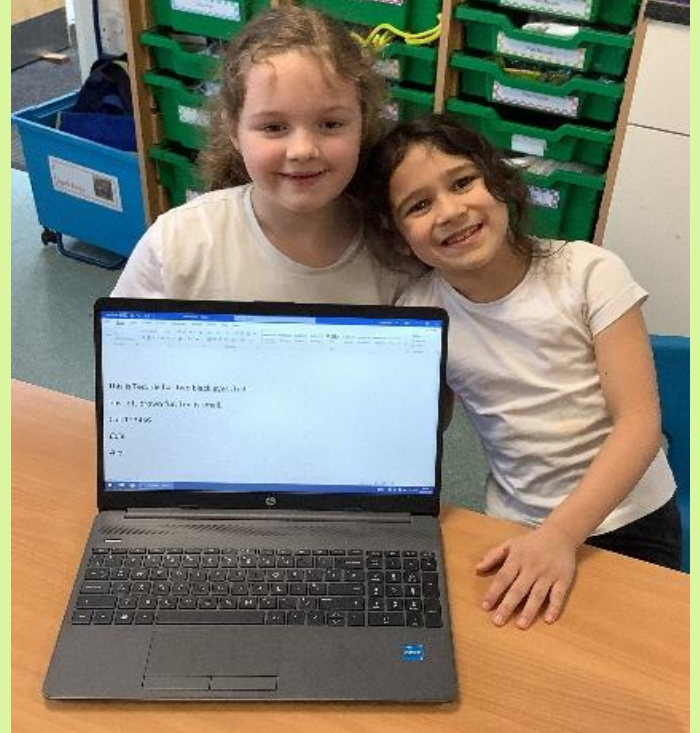

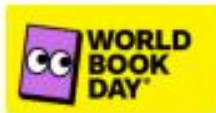

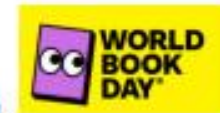

With just under a month to go, we wanted to remind you that World Book Day 2026 is now fast approaching!

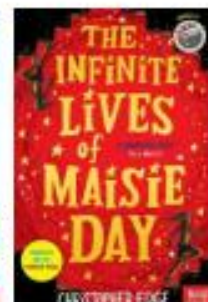
Coinciding with The National Year of Reading, World Book Day is bigger and better than ever before this year.

Author visit- Christopher Edge

Christopher is an award-winning children's author whose books have been translated into more than twenty languages. His novel 'The Infinite Lives of Maisie Day' won the STEAM Children's Book Prize and his last four novels were all nominated for the prestigious CILIP Carnegie Medal. We are incredibly lucky to have secured his visit to BJS through funding from the PTA.

"Please note: this is different to West Leigh's mystery book swap this year, where books are being wrapped up before they go into school."

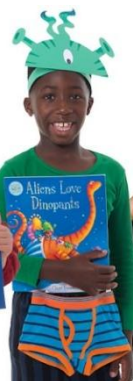
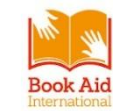
World Book Day £1 tokens

Y4 Writing Unit – Evolution

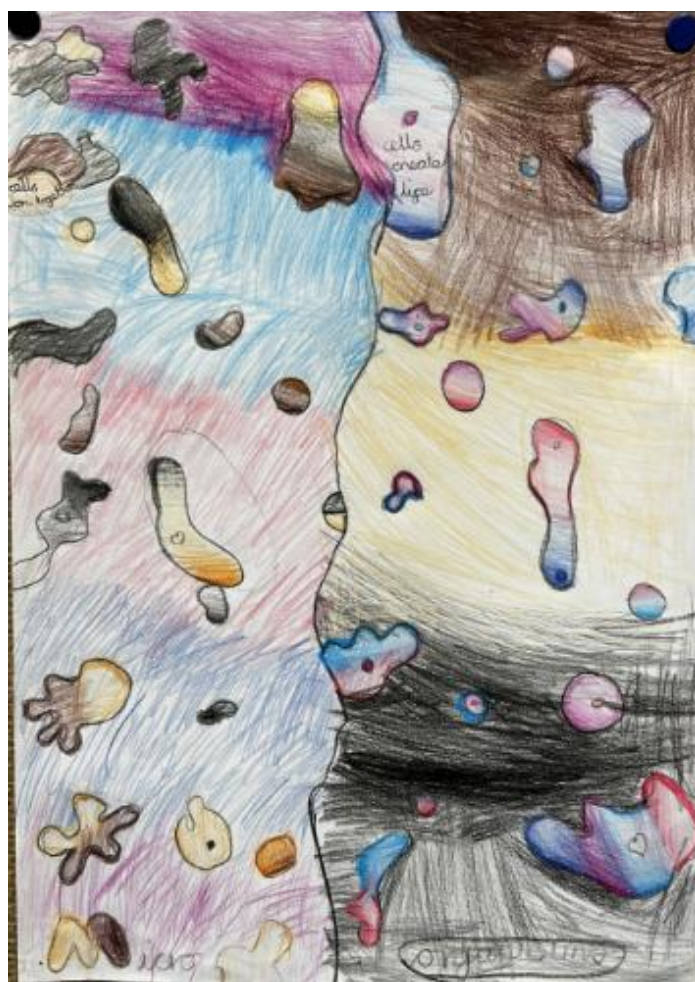

16 - 27 March 2026

Big Walk and Wheel is the UK's largest walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world.



Big Walk and Wheel challenge

Active travel is a great way to build physical activity into children's daily routine. It helps them arrive to school more relaxed and alert, and is great for their mental wellbeing. This year the challenge will run from 16 - 27 March 2026.

It is free and easy to take part in Big Walk and Wheel. You can register your school for the challenge from January 2026 at www.bigwalkandwheel.org.uk



How it works

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school.

A school's best five days will determine their final position and schools at the top of their leader boards will receive an exclusive Big Walk and Wheel certificate.



Prizes and badges

All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards if over 15% of your school takes part on each day of the challenge. Prizes up for grabs include accessories and equipment to help your school travel actively. All schools that participate in Big Walk and Wheel will also have the opportunity to earn virtual badges.

Parking at BJS

The school office have yet again been receiving a large number of neighbourhood complaints regarding parking at school and in the surrounding roads. There has been an increase in the number of parents dropping their children off by car directly opposite Backwell Juniors. We'd like to remind everyone that it is not permitted to stop on the painted zig zag lines outside school, but it is also unsafe to park on the road due to the narrowness of the lanes etc.

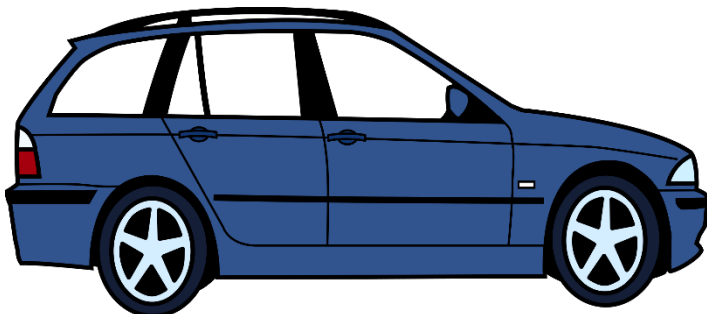
Several children have mentioned that they feel unsafe walking to and from school due to the speed and number of cars on this road and so we politely ask for you to refrain from dropping off in these areas and park on Dark Lane and walk the short distance to school to drop off/pick up. This additional 5 minutes is a small ask given these safety concerns.

Large vehicles have been unable to pass on Church Lane and the congestion level at school times is excessive.

As well as being very concerned about reports of people being rude to other road users and our neighbours we are very concerned that if larger vehicles are unable to pass then emergency vehicles will also be unable to reach a destination in an emergency situation which in turn could have devastating results to the community.

We ask you all to consider your parking – leave a little earlier for a space near school or park a little further away in a safe manner. Community Police have been informed and we have requested assistance in managing this going forward.
