
West Leigh PTA - Christmas Fundraising

Year 4 Church Day at St Andrew's Church

Recently, Year 4 attended an Advent themed Church Day at St Andrew's. Hannah C from 4JC has written an account of the day.

"We were split into 6 groups of 10 children. Each group took turns to go round 6 activities that had been planned for us. These included: Hand bells, Advent Wreaths, Angels, Stars, Carols and Advent Journey. With the hand bells, we were taught to play 'The first Noel'. It sounded beautiful. With the advent wreaths we were given a green floral sponge (oasis) and some season foliage. We put candle in the middle of the sponge and decorated round the outside with the foliage. With the stars, we had 2 star shaped pieces and we decorated them with colouring pens & stickers. For the 'Carols' activity, we had to pick either 'Silent Night' or 'Ding Dong Merrily'. Our task was to write alternative words to the carol. For our 'Angels' activity, we were given a clay head mask and we painted it to look like skin, we then added wool for hair and a fabric body and some wings to complete the look. For the advent journey activity, we played a board game all about the Nativity.

We all had such an interesting and enjoyable day at Church. It was a lovely start to Christmas and we learnt a lot.



Knowledgeable about many aspects of Ancient Greek life, he was also able to tell us about Ancient Greek medicine and the Battle of Marathon.

We then returned to our classrooms to plan and design a Greek flatbread. We thought about what filling we'd like to include- either rosemary, garlic or olives and prepared to make it in the afternoon.

Before lunch, we experienced some of the activities that children attending school (Athenian boys!) would have completed. This included writing using the Greek alphabet, the Greek number system and astronomy.

The afternoon saw us making the flatbreads and then eating them during our very own Ancient Greek feast.






